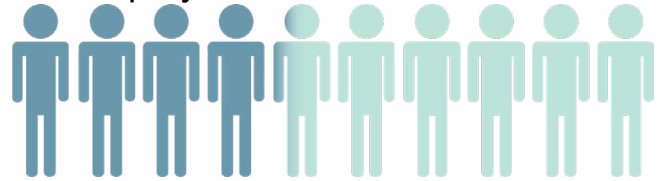

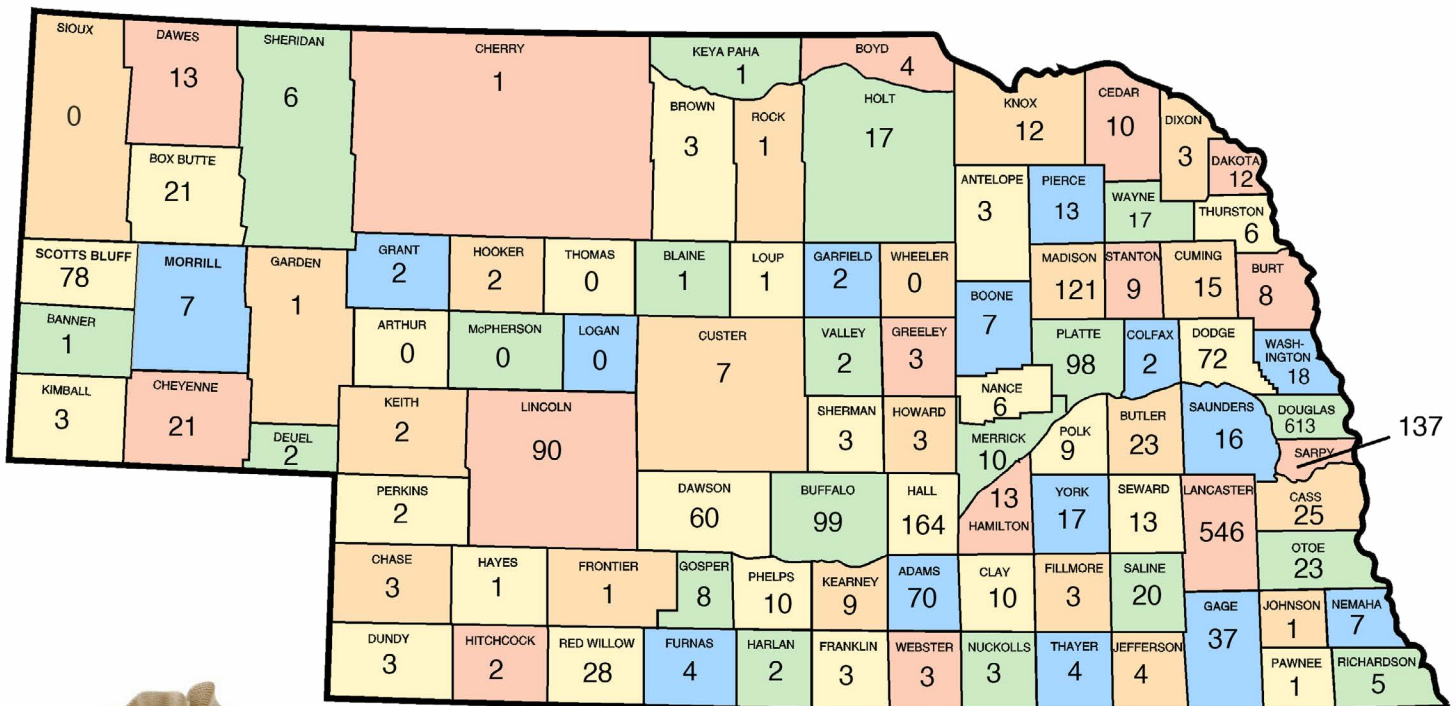

### Nebraska VR Clients Served by County



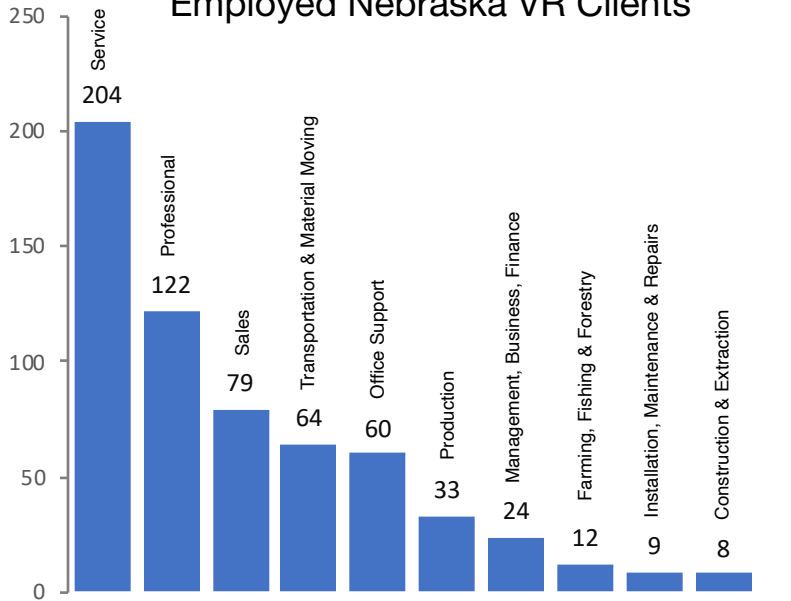
### Nebraska VR Funding

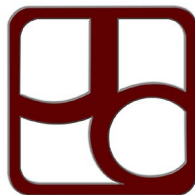

CPAP, a five-year grant awarded to Nebraska VR in 2015 from the United States Department of Education's Rehabilitation Services Administration (RSA) came to an end in June 2021. The grant allowed adults and youth with disabilities to acquire skills and credentials necessary to advance in high-demand industries. The strategy advanced incumbent workers, opened job opportunities for job seekers, and benefited business partners by cultivating workforce development through educational advancement and training.

The CPAP 2.0 grant was awarded from RSA in October 2021 and will continue through June 2026. Over the course of Year 1, the CPAP 2.0 team has conducted outreach to 178 businesses, setting the team on a path to exceed the original target of reaching 400 businesses over the course of the five-year project. The Business Pathways Specialists have also formulated Individualized Business Plans (IBPs) which outline the services and supports CPAP 2.0 will provide to business partners with the goal of advancing incumbent workers with disabilities.

The 10 IBPs signed in Fiscal Year 2022 are with Eakes Office Supply, Royal Engineered Composites, Sunheat, Middleton Electric, Masonite, Highline Warren, West Pharmaceutical Services, BD Medical, J & C Company, and Dave Janke Plumbing.
